What is Unarmed Civilian Protection?

Unarmed Civilian Protection is the practice of civilians protecting civilians in situations of violent conflict, imminent violence, and post-crisis situations. The practice of UCP is nonviolent and nonpartisan.

Proactive engagement, monitoring, relationship building, and capacity development are used: to prevent violence and reduce the impact of violence; to increase the safety and security of civilians threatened by violence; and to strengthen local peace infrastructures.
