CETL Course Design Tip



This week's tip: **Make the dock on your iPad work for you** - By default, the IOS puts four icons in the dock area. Did you know you can change this and even add two more for a total of six? To add or remove apps from the dock, tap AND HOLD any

icon on your home screen until the icons begin to wiggle. Once they start to wiggle, they become moveable. Tap and drag an app out of the dock or tap and drag an app into the dock. Once you have the icons arranged the way you like them, press the HOME button on your iPad to set the new arrangement. Remember, you can also add folders to organize your apps. I have one for "Mindmapping" where I house all of my mind mapping apps. Make your dock work for you!

The CETL is pleased to announce that Dr. Jimmy Franco, Associate Professor of Chemistry and Biochemistry, has been awarded a Faculty Fellowship. Dr. Franco's research will center on how technology can be used to tailor course content to better meet the needs of an increasingly diverse student population.
