Academic Success Center Update

<u>Academic Success Center</u> on the third floor of the McQuade Library has been very busy. During the fall 2016 semester the following took place:

- There were 2922 individual meetings with an <u>Academic Success Coach</u>. These took place with 662 distinct students. This included meetings with students in the <u>Compass Program</u> and <u>Promise Program</u>. Compass had 68 freshmen enrolled and Promise had 84.
- There were **1614** Writing Center student visits.
- There were 2129 Math tutoring visits at the <u>Tutoring and Math Center</u> by 500 unique students.
- There are 161 students currently on academic probation. This represents around 5% of our undergraduates. These students are closely monitored and are connected with an academic success coach so as to enhance their success.
- 402 exams were taken by students in our "testing center" through the Accessibility Services Office

Additionally, on January 18th, fifty Merrimack student tutors from across the college took part in a day-long **tutor training workshop**. More tutor training from the Tutoring and Math Center will be announced.

Finally, <u>The Accessibilities Office</u> has launched a new website. These new pages are designed to address questions and concerns of students, parents and faculty. Please take a look www.merrimack.edu/accessibility. The Director of Accessibility Services is happy to speak with faculty about specific issues and address questions. Currently, **350** students are signed up with the office and are seeking academic accommodations.
