- Tip #1 Did you know that for some students inverting colors or changing to grayscale makes reading on iPad easier? To enable this feature, go to Settings > General > Accessibility. This works with text, graphics, and video.
- Tip #2 English language learners in your classroom? Teaching a language? Take
  advantage of international keyboards. Choose Settings > General > Keyboard >
  Keyboards > Add New Keyboard. Next choose the language you wish to add. When
  you are ready to type, simply touch and hold the Globe button and choose the new
  keyboard.

- Effective and/or creative course design and redesign
- Employment of pedagogical techniques that are fair and respectful of differences among students
- Advisement and/or mentoring of students that reflect care, concern, and expertise
- Adjustment to interests and needs of students based upon formal and informal assessments
- Active involvement in student research projects
