CETL Workshop: Anti-Oppressive Teaching Techniques

Join us for a workshop on intersectional feminist pedagogy for social justice, with guest speaker Dr. Shannon Weber. The workshop will include tips for developing syllabi that foster inclusive teaching techniques and greater diversity. The workshop will also feature tips for dealing with microaggressions in the classroom.

Shannon Weber is a visiting lecturer in the Women's and Gender Studies Department at Wellesley College, whose work focuses on LGBTQ history, politics, and culture. Her book chapter, "Teaching Same-Sex Marriage as U.S. History," published in the Lambda Award-winning anthology *Understanding and Teaching U.S. Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, and Transgender History*, is written to assist college and high school educators alike in incorporating central insights from LGBTQ studies into general US history curriculum to promote diversity and inclusion for student populations across the country.

This workshop is sponsored by CETL and is the culmination of a year-long Teaching Circle on Anti-Oppressive conducted by Drs. Debra Michals and Raechel Tiffe in Women's and Gender Studies.
