RTTP consists of elaborate interdisciplinary games, set in the past, in which students are assigned roles informed by classic texts in the history of ideas. Class sessions are run entirely by students; instructors advise and guide students and grade their oral and written work. It seeks to draw students into the past, promote engagement with big ideas, and improve intellectual and academic skills. Reacting to the Past was honored with the 2004 Theodore Hesburgh Award (TIAA-CREF) for outstanding innovation in higher education. Learn to facilitate RTTP class sessions by playing one yourself! The Office of Global Education is adding over 15 new semester program options that will be available for student applications for the Spring 2018 Semester. With the addition of these new programs, the GEO hopes to better assist academic departments by providing options for majors in need of curricular options abroad.

The new programs afford our students opportunities to study more widely throughout the globe, from Chile to the Czech Republic, Belgium to the United Arab Emirates. Some of these new programs serve specific majors like the Monteverde, Costa Rica program in Environmental Studies and Sustainability. Other serve multiple departments like the Prague, Czech Republic program which has strong offerings in Art History, Communication Studies (including film studies and screenwriting), and Political Science. The Hyderabad, India and Sharjah, UAE programs provide both STEM and Liberal Arts with options. Additionally, the Sharjah program offers courses for Education. The three Global Institute sites--Berlin, Paris, and Rome—all have five academic tracks: Language, Literature, and Culture; Business; Communications, Journalism and New Media; Global and Community Health; and International Relations and Political Science. Lastly, there are programs that offer more regional studies for students interested in specific parts of the world, such as Rabat, Morocco and Iringa, Tanzania.

Dr. Liesl Smith, Director of Global Education, will be introducing the new programs at the final Faculty Senate meeting on May 18. The <u>Geo Programs Map</u> shows where the GEO programs fit with the various departments.
