Dr. Kyle McInnis dean of the new School of Health Sciences

Dear Colleagues,

It is with great pleasure that I announce Dr. Kyle McInnis as the founding dean of the new School of Health Sciences at Merrimack College (A formal opening ceremony for the School of Health Sciences is planned for later this fall).

A nationally recognized leader in the field of exercise science and sports medicine, Dr. McInnis has an extensive background as a teaching-scholar and innovator. Under his leadership during the past six years at the college, health sciences has grown from an academic department of 170 students with three undergraduate programs to one that now has over 550 students, offering five undergraduate and four graduate degrees.

During his tenure at Merrimack, Dr. McInnis has recruited top faculty, created an impressive administrative leadership team, and was instrumental in the planning of new facilities and equipment resources for teaching, learning and research. Dr. McInnis has also secured \$1.6 million in research funding from the prestigious Robert Wood Johnson Foundation for his nationally acclaimed Active Science program for underserved children.

Before joining Merrimack, Dr. McInnis was a faculty member and chair of exercise and health sciences at the University of Massachusetts-Boston. Dr. McInnis began his career at UMass in 1991 after receiving his doctoral degree in applied anatomy and physiology from Boston University.

Dr. McInnis has served in many leadership roles in the field of exercise and health sciences and is a fellow and trustee of the American College of Sports Medicine (ACSM), the world's preeminent sports medicine organization. He has also published over 100 scientific papers and given numerous presentations related to his work in areas such as child obesity, clinical exercise testing, and medical emergency preparedness in the exercise setting. His professional experience includes clinical and community-based research projects involving strategies aimed at increasing physical activity in underserved populations.

His professional affiliations have included the Dana Farber Cancer Institute/Harvard Cancer Center, Boston University Medical Center, and the Division of Nutrition and Metabolism at Massachusetts General Hospital. His work as the founding director of the GoKids program with UMass Boston and Children's Hospital Boston received a recognition service award from the U.S. surgeon general. As an innovator, Dr. McInnis has helped lead the way for using exercise technologies to improve health in children.

Please join me in congratulating Dr. McInnis in this important role and offer him all your support as he leads our new School of Health Sciences and works to continue the great momentum of Merrimack College.

Dr. Charlotte Berkes appointed the Laurence M. Demers Professor in the Life Sciences

I'm delighted to announce that the first-ever Laurence M. Demers Professorship in Life Science will be awarded to Dr. Charlotte Berkes, associate professor in the Department of Biology.

The Demers Professorship has been made possible by a generous and impactful gift from Dr. Laurence M. Demers '60 and Susan Demers '62.

The Demers Professorship was established to attract and retain outstanding faculty who have distinguished themselves through their teaching, research, scholarship and creative works. Appointment to a named professorship is intended to be the college's most prestigious recognition for continuing scholarly achievement and distinction.

In the selection of an individual for these appointments, teaching ability, character, industry, dedication, promise, stature and productivity in research and scholarship, artistic and creative accomplishment, and the best interests of the college are taken into consideration.

Dr. Berkes, who earned her Ph.D. in molecular and cellular biology at the University of Washington and joined our faculty in 2010, is an outstanding choice for the professorship. This opportunity will provide support to continue her mid-career development as a teacher and her research and scholarship on fungal pathogenesis, antifungal drug discovery and innate immunity.

Dr. Demers is distinguished professor emeritus of pathology and medicine at the M.S. Hershey Medical Center of The Pennsylvania State University. He was the founding director of clinical chemistry and the endocrine laboratory in the University Hospital and director of the clinical research center core laboratory. Dr. Demers also served as chair of the Board of Trustees at Merrimack and remains deeply involved as a member of the College Leadership Council.

Please join me in congratulating Dr. Berkes on this achievement, and expressing our gratitude to Dr. and Mrs. Demers for their significant support for teaching and learning at Merrimack.
