Update on the Girard School Dean Search

The Dean of the Girard School search is well underway, and we are extremely excited about the future of the School. There have been several notable developments to share with you:

Recruitment Efforts: Our search consultants from the national search firm of Storbeck/Pimentel & Associates have started the process of contacting candidates who have been nominated by others, as well as actively recruiting prospective candidates from their database.

Timeline: The Search Committee has begun the review of applications and will continue to review applications through early October. We are on track to conduct our preliminary interviews in mid-October with the goal of having candidates on campus in late October.

The Office of the Provost will update you as we move along in the process and will keep you informed of the progress of the search committee's work. It is our hope that we identify and select the best individual possible to help lead the Girard School.

IRB Update

The Institutional Review Board (IRB) will continue its review of full proposals this fall. The IRB meeting schedule is shown below. It is important that proposals get submitted to the IRB at least 10 business days prior to the formal IRB meeting dates.

In other IRB news, the IRB will be transitioning to an online protocol submission system (Cayuse) by October 1st. The IRB leadership has been working the past six weeks on preparing and testing the new online system. The IRB will provide a series of training sessions for faculty and students when the online system goes live, and dates and times for the training will be posted here in the Provost Briefing. The new online system will provide a much more streamlined and efficient protocol submission and review process and will signal the end of using those clunky paper forms.
