**Call for Proposals: Spring 2018** 

The Davis Educational Foundation Grants will support experiential learning course development with stipends of \$1,000 for up to three faculty during the Spring 2018 semester. Proposals should result in a new or improved experiential education course or program with a preference for courses geared toward first and second-year students. Experiential components include work-integrated learning (co-op, internship, externship); undergraduate research; study abroad; study away; service learning; travel stipend for student/professor conference paper presentation; and community engagement. Proposals should be one page and include proposal title and a brief plan for peer dissemination and implementation. ## The First Year Experience Program is Now Accepting Applications

#### FYE1000, Instructor Description and Application Link

First Year Experience Instructor candidates must have a master's degree, have been an employee of the College for a full year at the start of the fall 2018 semester, obtain the signature of a current supervisor/department chair, and if they are a new applicant must also attend a brief interview with one of the FYE Co-Chairs in the spring semester. The academic department in which an applicant has received their terminal degree will certify the qualifications of each FYE Instructor. #### Academic Calendar Reminder: Presidents' Day Federal Holiday

The Calendar Advisory Committee, together with the Office of the Provost, would like to remind all faculty about a difference in the current academic calendar from those in prior years: **there is now a single, unified academic calendar for all undergraduate and graduate programs.** 

Specifically, for Spring 2018, this means that all programs (undergraduate and graduate) will follow a Monday class schedule on Tuesday, February 20. As in Fall 2017, this calendar will also include a two-day weekday reading period as part of the instructional semester to serve as a bridge between the end of classes and the start of exams.

Due to the observance of holidays (often on Mondays), adjustments are necessary in order to ensure an even distribution of class weekdays (M-T-W-R-F) throughout the semester. If these adjustments are not performed, classes meeting on certain weekdays would have an insufficient number of meetings throughout the semester, potentially leading to issues with federal credit-hour and accreditation (NEASC) requirements. Typically, these adjustments are performed by substituting Merrimack's Monday class schedule on a Tuesday (usually Columbus Day in the fall and Presidents' Day in the spring).

Faculty teaching Monday courses in the spring are encouraged to clearly note in their syllabi that due to the *Presidents' Day Federal Holiday* class will be held on Tuesday, February 20, on a Monday schedule and at their discretion may be flexible regarding attendance for those with unavoidable conflicts due to the switch in class dates for that week.

#### **Student Speaker: Call for Nominations**

Merrimack's 68th commencement exercises, the College's first joint ceremony, will be held May 20 for both undergraduates and graduates in our new stadium. The College will continue its tradition of having both an undergraduate and graduate speaker, each sharing the memories and aspirations of their peers, at the ceremony. The student speaker selection committee is now soliciting nominations from the entire Merrimack community for potential student speakers. Self-nominations are welcome. A nomination should include:

- Nominee's name
- Field(s) of study
- Brief statement (1-2 sentences) in support of the nomination

Nominations will be accepted through midnight **Friday**, **February 23**. Please send them to <u>commencementoffice@merrimack.edu</u> with the subject line: Undergraduate and Graduate Speakers.

Please Note: Each nominee, undergraduate or graduate, must be on their respective commencement list for spring 2018; the undergraduate speaker must have a 3.25 GPA as of January 2018, which the committee will verify before proceeding. Once nominations close, each nominee will be asked to accept the nomination and, if so, to submit a brief sketch of what they wish to address in a speech.

Speaker finalists will audition later this spring.

## **Local and Global Educational Community Engagement**
