Last year during Lent, the Grace J. Palmisano Center for Campus Ministry sponsored our first annual Backpack Drive. This drive is different than the other drives we sponsor, such as the toy and gift card drive during Advent and Christmas that brings happiness into the life of the child. This collection is more somber and certainly more sad. This drive is in coordination with the Massachusetts Department of Children and Family Services. We have been asked for help as they deal with the tragic brokenness of families and the unfortunate need to relocate children in danger to safety. Specifically, they are requesting donations of items that would fill overnight backpacks with supplies a child or a teenager would need when they must be placed in Emergency Foster Care for one or two nights.

themselves may be gently used but the clothing and other supplies should be new. Donations can include anything from fully loaded backpacks to single items on the list.
