

CITI Training for IRB

The Merrimack College Institutional Review Board (IRB) would like to remind you that CITI (Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative) training is now required for all faculty and students interested in getting certification to work on human subjects. Beginning in September 2018, we will no longer accept NIH training certification for any research requiring IRB review.

Why the transition to CITI? CITI training is a nationally recognized human subjects research and compliance training program. CITI provides a comprehensive and holistic training certification that is more widely recognized and accepted than our previous NIH training.

Blackboard Changes for All Fall Classes 2018

This transition will occur in stages, beginning fall 2018. In addition to a new navigation bar on all course shells, faculty may also opt-in to the new full-course Ultra version this summer.
