

## Pre-Law Minor Requirements

The *Pre-Law Minor* is an interdisciplinary law minor for students who are interested in attending law school, who plan on pursuing legal related careers, or who want to learn more about different areas of the law that may be relevant to their professional careers or to legal areas they are likely to encounter in their personal lives.

The Pre-Law Minor requires completing a minimum of **18 credits** in courses that satisfy the Minor requirements. The Pre-Law Minor requirement is five courses: two required courses and three electives. An experiential learning component is also required.

**1. Two (2) courses are required of all Pre-Law minors:**

- (1) POL2122 Law and Society  
or MGT3330 Legal Environment of Business (for Management Concentrates in Business only)
- (2) POL3151 American Constitutional Law  
or POL3152 Civil Liberties and Civil Rights

**2. At least three (3) elective courses selected from:**

- POL3150 Criminal Law
- POL3151 American Constitutional Law
- POL3152 Civil Liberties and Civil Rights
- CRM2800 Search and Seizure
- MGT3320 Employment Law and Labor Relations
- SPM3500 Legal Environment of Sports
- WGS3710 Gender and the Law

**3. Completion of an Experiential Learning Component**

*\* Must be approved by department and completed by Feb. 1 of senior year*

i.e. Experiential Learning Component includes: Internship, Moot Court, or engaging in additional activities that expose students to practical experience in the law. Please refer to the Pre-Law Minor Experiential Learning Component Form. **We recommend reviewing this form and planning ahead as soon as you declare your minor.**

Please note that on-line pre-law courses do not qualify to meet the five (5) course or 18 credit requirement for the pre-law minor.

Only two (2) Political Science courses may be double-counted between a Pre-Law minor and a Political Science major/minor.
