The "Roving Archivist Program" connects a professional archivist with holders of historical records. Merrimack has been awarded a Strategic Assessment and Program Review grant. A site visit and consultation will result in a report of recommendations and a list of resources customized to our institution from the Massachusetts Roving Archivist.
