Faculty Spotlight: Mark Allman

Dr. Allman received his PhD in Christian Ethics from Loyola University of Chicago. His main research interests are Political Theology and War & Peace Studies. His main teaching interests are Social, Political and Economic Ethics.

Prior to Merrimack College, Dr. Allman was an Assistant Professor of Philosophy & Religious Studies at Mt. Union College in Alliance, OH. At Merrimack, Dr. Allman is an Associate Professor in the Department of Religious and Theological Studies, Faculty Associate for the Center for the Study of Jewish-Christian-Muslim Relations at Merrimack and co-editor for the Journal of the Society of Christian Ethics.

He is currently teaching Honors RTS 1100 Christianity in Context. Next

semester he will be teaching Ethics in the Abrahamic Traditions, both honors and non-honors sections.

Ethics in the Abrahamic Traditions explores contemporary ethical issues (capitol punishment, embryonic stem cell research, gender issues, same sex marriage, etc.) from Jewish, Christian and Muslim perspectives by looking for similarities and differences between the way these 3 sister religions understand right and wrong behavior as well as concepts of justice in society.

Student Spotlight: Jocelyn Cordell

Jocelyn Cordell is a senior Romance Languages Major from Bedford, New Hampshire with two minors in Music and International Affairs. A current honors program participant with a perfect academic record, Jocelyn has recently returned from a Fall semester abroad in Angers, France where she was featured as a soloist in a selection of sacred Baroque repertoire by Monteverdi, Lully, and Charpentier. An accomplished classical soprano, Jocelyn regularly performs with the Jazz Ensemble, Concert Choir, Mackapella, and Music Ministry on campus in addition to regularly participating in the Merrimack Onstager's theatrical productions (she will be playing Lenore in this spring's musical *Dirty Rotten Scoundrels*). Her musical passions

served as the catalyst for the Honors Program Service Learning collaboration with nationally acclaimed composer Dan Ellsey in conjunction with Mackapella. In the spring of 2011, the team composed and presented a combined instrumental piece titled *Memories of Autumn: Trust in the Values of Friendship*, which consisted of both a live acoustic orchestra and a complementary electronic score created through a software program developed by MIT professor Todd Machover. In regards to the project:

"I was looking for a way to be apart of music while also giving back and Dan was looking to collaborate with Merrimack," said Cordell. "When we met it was an instant connection. We were able to combine our talents and create a piece that is the best of both

worlds, all while developing a deep friendship."

While not singing or composing, Jocelyn participates in a variety of activities including Model UN as Head delegate and as a Music Chairwoman of her sorority Alpha Sigma Tau. Next year, she plans to return back to

France to teach English before pursuing graduate studies in International Diplomacy.
