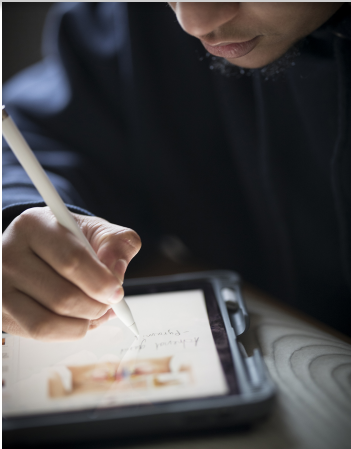

at 4 p.m.*

Randall Horton is the recipient of the Gwendolyn Brooks Poetry Award, the Bea Gonzalez Poetry Award, and a National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship. He is the author of the poetry collections, *PITCH DARK ANARCHY*, *THE DEFINITION OF PLACE*, *THE LINGUA FRANCE OF NINTH STREET*, and most recently, *{#289-128}*. His new memoir, *DEAD WEIGHT: A MEMOIR IN ESSAYS*, is forthcoming in 2022. His performance group, *Heroes Are Gang Leaders*, received the 2018 American Book Award in Oral Literature. The only Full Professor in the United States with seven felony convictions, Randall currently sits on the Advisory Board of Pen America's Pen Prison Writing Program.

Randall will also hold a workshop for incarcerated students at the Essex County Jail.

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## *Hugh Hinton Receives National Choral Conducting Prize*



Director of Campus Music Activities [Hugh Hinton](#) was announced as the winner of the 2021 Choir Master Prize in choral conducting by the American Guild of Organists. This award is given each year to the person who earns the top score in the national Choir Master certification examination.

Hugh traveled to New York City in June for the examination, where he led a professional choir before a panel of distinguished judges. He also earned top score in a written comprehensive examination in the areas of choral conducting, choral repertoire, sacred music, liturgy and hymnody.

This certification is considered the professional equivalent of a doctoral degree in choral conducting and sacred music. The American Guild of Organists was chartered in 1896 by the Board of Regents, University of the State of New York, to administer national examinations for professional certification in organ playing, choral conducting, and sacred music. As director of choral activities and liturgical music at Merrimack, Hugh Hinton leads the Concert Choir and the Schola Liturgical Choir in concerts and worship for the Merrimack community.

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The Maximizing Investigators' Research Award (MIRA) provides support for the program of research in an investigator's laboratory that is within the mission of National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS). The goal of MIRA is to increase the efficiency and efficacy of NIGMS funding.

It is anticipated that this program will:

- Increase the stability of funding for NIGMS-supported investigators, which could enhance their ability to take on ambitious scientific projects and approach problems more creatively;
- Increase flexibility for investigators to follow important new research directions within the NIGMS mission as opportunities arise, rather than being bound to specific aims proposed in advance of the studies;
- More widely distribute funding among the nation's highly talented and promising investigators to increase overall scientific productivity and the chances for important breakthroughs;
- Reduce the time spent by researchers writing and reviewing grant applications, allowing them to spend more time conducting research;
- Enable investigators to devote more time and energy to mentoring trainees in a more stable research environment.

This Funding Opportunity Announcement (FOA) allows both new applications from eligible NIGMS-funded investigators and renewal applications from current established and early-stage MIRA grantees.
