



Graduation Rates for Years 2015-2024

Graduation rates represent the number of students entering the institution as full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in a particular year (cohort). They are reported for up to 150% of normal time to completion (6 years). Graduation rates are for students pursuing bachelor’s degrees (or equivalent), based on data as of the institutional fall freeze and as reported to the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).
