



At Merrimack, we are committed to making a private education affordable. Not only will you get all the academic programs and resources you'd expect from a large university, but you'll also benefit from personalized attention, added amenities and support services that are unique to Merrimack.

Tuition

Sticker price can be startling—especially when you haven't been reviewed for scholarships and aid yet. The good news is that "sticker price" (aka the full price you see listed for tuition, etc.) is almost never the actual amount that students pay.

Merit Scholarships

When you apply you are automatically considered for merit scholarships up to \$28,500. You will find out about your scholarship(s) at point of admission.

Financial Aid

Living On Campus

Students are guaranteed housing all four years at

Merrimack! Housing can range from singles to doubles to apartment style. Students can choose from a variety of meal plans to meet their needs. Together, on-campus housing and meal plan costs can range from \$19,995 to \$22,917 per year.
